

Guide - Completing the Student visa form for applications made outside the UK.

The Quality and Visa Compliance Officer endeavours to ensure that the information in this guide is accurate but please note that legislation is subject to change at short notice.

This guide should be used with the student route caseworker guidance which can be found on the [GOV.UK website](#) and our [Outside the UK - Student visa requirements guide](#).

Before applying online

Please read through our other guide [Outside the UK - Student visa requirements guide](#). You should only submit your visa application once you meet all the requirements and can submit any necessary documents. Once you pay for your visa application online, you will not be able to make any changes to your form and there may be limitations on withdrawing your application and receiving an application fee refund. **Your visa application date is considered to be the date you pay the application fee, not the date you enrol biometrics at a Visa Application Centre (if required to).**

Applying online

- To start your application, [go to this GOV.UK web page](#).
- If you answer 'Yes' to having an EEA or Swiss passport, you will be directed to prove your identity via the **UK Immigration: ID Check App** and to register for a UK Visas & Immigration account. Please go to page 16 of this guide now for information about this process and how to complete the form. If you're unable to use the app then please continue reading the guide from here.
- Confirm your visa type as **Student**
- Select a country to provide your biometrics
- Check and confirm the availability of biometric enrolment locations

Note: You can find the opening times, address and contact details for UK visa application centres near you on [this GOV.UK website](#).

If you have dependants, family members who will also need a visa to come to the UK with you, you will need to make a separate application. There is a link on [this GOV.UK webpage](#) to do so. To find out more about which students can bring dependants and the maintenance requirements to do so, please see our guide, [Outside the UK - Student visa requirements guide](#).

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Register your email to create your account

Enter an email address and password so you can save your answers. You will then be emailed a unique link to let you log back in to your application at a later point, if needed.

Throughout your application, you can select the option to 'Return to this application later' in order to re-send the link to your latest saved application.

Email address

Create a password

Your password must be 8 characters or longer and include a letter and a number or symbol.

Repeat your password

Save and continue

Remember to use a reliable email address that you can check daily. Keep a note of your password somewhere safe. You will be sent a verification email asking you to verify your email address. You will need to do this before submitting your visa application.

You will also be asked to provide a contact telephone number. Enter your preferred contact details including choosing the method by which you would like UK Visas and Immigration to contact you about your application.

If you need to pause your application, then always make sure you log out of your account. You will be sent a unique link to your application to your registered email address. You can use this link to return to your form and log back in.

Do you have a Fulbright, Marshall, Chevening or Commonwealth Scholarship?

If you are receiving a full Fulbright, Chevening, Marshall or Commonwealth Scholars tick 'yes' when asked about this. If you are a full Fulbright, Chevening, Marshall or Commonwealth Scholars you will be exempt from paying the Immigration Health Surcharge and visa fee at the end of the application.

Do you have a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) number?

Once you have received an unconditional offer or have fulfilled the conditions of your conditional offer for your programme, you can start your registration. Once both your UK and French registration are complete, you can [request](#) a CAS via the London Campus website. This is an electronic document created by the London Campus within the UK Visas and Immigration computer system. Your CAS statement will be issued to you by email. If you do not have a valid CAS you must not submit your application. If you submit your application without one or with a CAS you have previously used, your application is likely to be rejected as invalid or refused.

Your name

You must give your name exactly as it appears in your current passport. If your Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) does not match the name given in your passport you will need to request an amendment to your CAS before applying for your visa.

In addition to the names already provided, are you now or have you ever been known by another name?

If your name is different to that given in your passport, you will need to declare this on your application form and may need to provide original evidence to explain the name change (i.e. a marriage certificate, birth certificate, deed poll document). We recommend you submit evidence of any legal name changes with your application. If you need further advice, then email admin-dauphinelondon@dauphine.psl.eu

Your address and previous address history

In this section you will be asked to provide the addresses (UK or overseas) that you lived at in the past 2 years and the ownership status. You will need to be as accurate as you can with your dates.

Passport details and personal information

You must make sure your passport details; national identity card details (if applicable) and personal information are entered accurately. Your passport details must match the passport details on your CAS. If you get a new passport after your CAS is issued, please reply to your CAS email with a scan of the new passport. You should wait for further instructions before continuing with your visa application. If you have any additional passports (you have dual nationality) or previous passports in your possession you are advised to submit them with your application.

Have you provided evidence of your English language ability in a previous application?

You must have been granted a visa or permission to stay after meeting the language requirement at level B1 or above. For example:

- scored level B1, B2, C1 or C2 on an [approved English language test](#) which assessed your reading, writing, speaking and listening skills
- have a degree which was taught in English
- have an English language or literature GCSE, an International GCSE, an A level, or a Scottish National 4 or 5, Higher, or Advanced Higher qualification
- if you were a student, your sponsor confirmed on your CAS that you met the required level

If you have previously been required to submit evidence of your English language ability to support a Tier 4 (General) student or Student visa application, then answer 'yes'. If this is your first time studying in the UK then the answer is 'No'.

The next set of **questions are about your English language assessment. If you answered 'Yes' to the previous question 'Have you provided evidence of your English language ability in a previous application?'**, you may not see these additional English language questions.

Do you have an English language or literature qualification from a UK school?

Read the guidance on screen and answer Yes or No. If you're unsure, please contact us.

Are you coming to the UK to study at a higher education provider with a track record of compliance?

Universite Paris dauphine – PSL, London campus is a 'Private Provider' and so the answer to this question will be 'No'.

Does your Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) statement indicate that your English language ability was assessed by your institution or that you are a 'gifted' student?

Refer to the English language section of your CAS. If your CAS states the following then the answer to this question is 'Yes'. If your CAS doesn't match the wording below, read our [requirements guide](#) for more information.

Does anyone rely on you for financial support?

The form asks if you have any family members, whether they are travelling to the UK with you or not, who are financially dependent on you. You must enter the details of these family members and indicate whether they will be coming to the UK with you for the duration of your studies.

Please refer to our [guide](#) which explains the rules on family dependants. If you are allowed to bring dependants, once you have completed **your application**, you will need to go to [GOV.UK](#) to create a separate application for each dependant traveling with you. For more information about dependant applications, please see the [UKCISA website](#) and [Dependants of Students, Immigration Rules 28.1 to 39.3](#).

Give details about your parent(s).

You will need to complete this section accurately. There is an option to say that you don't have these details and to explain why.

Do you have any family in the UK?

If you have family in the UK you will be required to provide information about them.

Do you know where you will be staying in the UK?

It is important that UK Visas and Immigration can contact you, so enter the full UK address you intend to live at during your stay in this section. If you do not know your UK address, or you are yet to arrange your accommodation, you will need to answer 'No' to this question and explain what your plans are in the free text box.

Once you are in the UK you must keep UK Visas and Immigration updated about any change of circumstances such as your address. Visit [GOV.UK](https://www.gov.uk) for more details.

Will you be travelling to the UK as part of an organised group?

If you select 'Yes' to this question, the form will ask you to provide further details.

Will you be travelling to the UK with someone who is not your partner, spouse, or dependant?

If you travel to the UK with someone who is not your partner, spouse or child, select 'Yes' to this question. The form will ask you to provide further details. The form only allows you to include the details of one person, even if you will be travelling with more.

Travel Information / Travel History (UK and other countries)

Have you been to the UK in the past 10 years?

In this section you will be asked to provide details of any trips you have made to the UK and to select other countries in the last 10 years.

It is a good idea to have your current and previous passports available when you complete this section. If you have a record of previous travel such as tickets, boarding passes or itineraries, these will also help you.

It is important in this section and throughout the form to be as accurate as possible. However, if you cannot remember an exact date of travel, just enter the month and year, then enter the 1st day of that month as the date.

You will then be asked about travel to other countries and whether you have ever been given medical treatment in the UK.

UK leave to remain

This question is asking whether you have previously applied for a visa in the UK. If the answer is yes, please give information here.

Travel to Australia, Canada, New Zealand, USA, Switzerland or the European Economic Area and World travel history questions

As in the previous section, if you have been to any of these destinations, please list as accurately as

possible the dates and duration of each trip.

Your planned travel information

The form will ask for your date of intended travel to the UK. This is only an indication of when you might travel to the UK and does not mean you will need to arrive on this date. It's important to enter this carefully as it will impact when your visa will be valid from. Please note the earliest your visa can be valid is one month before your course start date.

If your programme is longer than 6 months:

Your visa will be valid 1 month before the course start date listed on your CAS or 7 days prior to your intended date of travel, whichever is later.

You must answer all questions truthfully, including providing information for any country you have lived in or travelled to. Selecting an option from the list will direct you to another page or free text box where you can add further details.

Will you be studying at a school or higher education institution?

UCAS details

If you have applied for your course through [UCAS](#), your UCAS application number will be on your CAS or on any correspondence you have received from UCAS.

Parcoursup details

If you have applied for your course through Parcoursup, your Parcoursup application number will be on your CAS or on any correspondence you have received from Parcoursup.

MyCandidature details

If you have applied for your course through MyCandidature, your MyCandidature application number will be on your CAS or on any correspondence you have received from MyCandidature.

Student Number

Only students coming from Dauphine Paris will be able to use their student number for their visa application.

Direct application details

If you have applied for your course through our UK and International Procedure, your application number will be 001 + followed by your date of birth (i.e. 00110022007) and will be on your CAS.

Do you need to obtain permission from the ATAS?

Currently, Université Paris Dauphine – PSL, London campus do not run any courses that require students to obtain approval from the Academic Technology Approval Scheme (ATAS). You can therefore answer 'No' to this question and continue.

Will you be receiving money from an official financial sponsor for your continuing studies?

Only certain types of financial sponsors are acceptable for visa purposes. Read our [guide](#) to understand who an 'official financial sponsor' can be. If your official financial sponsor is only sponsoring you for part of your tuition fees and maintenance costs, then you must tick *'I am not being wholly sponsored'*.

If you are using personal funds in your name or your parent(s)' name or receiving a student loan tick 'No' as these are not financial sponsors as defined by UKVI. Read our [guide](#) for more information about loans.

Course information

The official name of your course, qualification level, and start and end dates can be found on your CAS. You must ensure the information is entered correctly as per your own CAS.

Are you applying to continue on the same course of study?

Select 'yes' if you have been granted permission for this course before. For example, you need more time to finish your course due to repeating a year.

Have you or your parent(s)/legal guardian(s) already paid any money to your sponsor for accommodation?

Universite Paris Dauphine – PSL, London campus does not provide accommodation, therefore you do not pay fees directly to Universite Paris Dauphine – PSL, London campus and therefore this money cannot be mentioned in your application. Please tick 'No'.

What are your course fees for your first year?

Enter the amount that is shown on your CAS statement.

Have you or your parent(s) or legal guardian(s) already paid any of your course fees?

Write here how much money you have already paid towards your tuition fees. This information should match what is on your CAS statement.

How can you prove this amount has been paid?

Your CAS statement should confirm how much money you have paid towards your tuition fees. If the fees paid information on your CAS is incorrect you must request for an update to your CAS before submitting your visa application. To request an amendment to your CAS please email admin-dauphinelondon@dauphine.psl.eu

Are any of the funds required for this application in the form of a student loan?

If you are receiving a student loan that meets the requirements of the student visa, then answer 'Yes'. Full details are in our [guide](#).

Have you already received your student loan?

If you are using a student loan which has **not** yet been disbursed to your personal bank account, you will need to answer 'No'.

Are all of the maintenance funds required for this application in a bank account with your name on it?

If you are only using funds in a bank account with your name on it to prove that you meet the financial requirements, click 'Yes'.

If you are using a student loan you will need to answer 'No' unless the loan has already been disbursed to your bank account.

If you are using a combination of a student loan, which has **not** yet been disbursed to your bank account, **and** funds held in a bank account in your name then the answer is still 'No'. You can then use the 'Additional information about your application' section on the form to explain how you meet the maintenance requirements.

If you have answered 'No' to this question, you will be asked if you are using a bank account in your parent(s)' or legal guardian's name.

If you have answered 'Yes' to relying on money held in a bank account under your parent(s) or legal guardian(s) to this question, you must confirm that you have permission from your parent(s) or legal guardian(s) to use their money and confirm how you can prove the parental relationship.

Additional information

Here you can add in any information you may wish to add or clarify in your application.

*****Check your answers carefully*****

You can then use the 'Change', 'Add' and 'Remove' buttons on the right-hand side of each question to make any necessary amendments to your application.

Evidence showing the required maintenance funds

This question will appear if you have stated that your maintenance funds are held in a bank account in your name or your parent's name. You will be able to add information about a second bank account in the next screen if necessary.

A common reason for Student visa refusal is a problem with financial documents or an incorrect amount of funds being shown. [Read our guidance](#) for information on maintenance requirements and the documentary requirements. If you cannot meet the maintenance requirements in the manner specified by UK Visas and Immigration, then you must not continue with this application. If you need to speak to our Quality and Visa Compliance Officer, please email admin-dauphinelondon@dauphine.psl.eu

You must provide evidence showing that you have the required maintenance funds to cover living costs and fees for you and any of your dependants while you are in the UK.

For information on how much money you need to show, [refer to the guidance document here](#).

Enter details about the financial evidences you will send. You will be able to provide details of several evidences if you need to.

If your money is held in a different country, you will need to check if your bank meets the [requirements](#).

Documents, Conditions and Declaration

When you are happy that you have answered all the questions accurately, click continue to proceed to the document check list (example below).

You must provide all the listed original documents as part of your application. Tick the box to agree that you will provide each document.

The screenshot below is just an example, your list of Mandatory Documents may be different.

TB tests are not always listed in the Mandatory Documents section so make sure to include it if required to.

You will then be asked to read and agree to a set of conditions and a declaration. Once you have agreed to the declaration you will no longer be able to make changes to your application.

Mandatory documents

These documents are mandatory and you must provide them as part of your application. Tick the box to agree that you will provide each document:

Other documents

If you do not provide these documents, your application may be delayed or refused.

The birth certificate for test test

This must be a full birth certificate that shows the names of both of your parents.

Statements from a personal bank or building society account (HSBC)

A letter of permission from your legal guardian(s)/parent(s) confirming use of their money and relationship to you

If you provided any qualification evidence to your sponsor for them to issue your CAS, you must submit this evidence (including translations). For example, you might have sent your sponsor your certificate of qualification or transcript of results.

Immigration Health Surcharge

You will now be asked to pay the Immigration Health Surcharge (IHS). You must do this before you can complete and submit your visa application.

You must pay your Immigration Health Surcharge (IHS) before you can complete your visa application. You will pay your IHS on another website, then return to this site to complete and pay for your application.

If you are exempt, you will still need to get a reference number from the IHS website.

Your IHS reference number will automatically be included on your application once you pay and return to this site.



Your answers will be locked when you go to the IHS website, even if you do not pay your IHS straight away. If you need to make any changes to your answers you must do so now.

Save and continue

When you click on 'Go to IHS website' you will be redirected to another website. Here you will be asked to check that your personal details are correct. You will also be asked to provide some information about your course. Use your CAS to help you. Once you have made the IHS payment you will be re-directed back to your application to complete the final steps and pay the visa application fee. The fee may be converted to your local currency at rates set by the Home Office.

Payment and biometric enrolment appointment

You will now need to follow the instructions on screen to book an appointment to enrol biometrics and find out how you should submit your documents. You then need to pay the visa application fee. This may be converted to your local currency at rates set by the Home Office

It is important that you save a copy of your completed application to your computer (or print a copy) for your records as well as your Document Checklist. You are also advised to keep copies of all your visa supporting documents.

You should read the onscreen instructions on further steps you need to take as this varies from country to country.

When you receive your visa

You'll receive either a letter or email confirming the decision on your application. It is important that you keep this somewhere safe as it is proof of your grant of permission and carries details of the conditions of your permission. If successful, you'll also be given a visa sticker (called a vignette) in your passport.

If you are coming to the UK for more than 6 months, your vignette is usually valid for 90 days. The 90-day vignette allows you to travel to the UK during the validity dates on the vignette. However, you must also access your eVisa which is a digital visa for the duration of your immigration permission.

If you find any errors on your vignette, contact the Visa Application Centre immediately for the error to be corrected before you travel to the UK.

Final checks

Now you have completed the online application please make sure you have done everything you need to do:

- Checked all your supporting documents using [our online guidance](#), also the [Student visa policy guidance](#)
- Checked that all the information on your CAS is correct
- Paid the Immigration Health Surcharge – [please use our online guidance](#).
- Attended a TB test if required – please see the [Gov.UK website](#) for information
- Prepare to submit your biometrics as part of your application
- Read the instructions you are given about submitting your documents and attending your student visa appointment as these vary from country to country
- Once you receive your visa, check that the information on it is correct, if not contact the embassy/agency that processed your application.
- Travel to the UK and provide your immigration documents at enrolment (upon your arrival at the London campus).

EU, EEA, and Swiss citizens using the UK Immigration: ID Check App

As part of the application process, you'll need to submit the online application form at [GOV.UK](https://www.gov.uk) and verify your identity. You'll be able to verify your identity using a smartphone, your biometric passport and the 'UK Immigration: ID Check' app. If you're unable to use the app for any reason, you will need to attend a Visa Application Centre (VAC) to submit your biometric information and any supporting documents. You will also need to complete the online visa form using the instructions starting on page 1 of this form. You should start your application on [GOV.UK](https://www.gov.uk) and you'll be told how to go ahead with either the app or by visiting a VAC.

If you're able to use the app, you'll be asked to create a UK Visas & Immigration account. You will receive a 6-digit code to your email address and mobile number. The email also contains the link to log-in to your application form if you need to go back to it at any stage. For security purposes, each time you log-in to your account, you will need the following information:

- your identity document number so always keep a record of this if you lose/update your passport or biometric identity card
- your date of birth
- access to your phone or email as you will be sent a security code to sign in via email or mobile phone

If you're having difficulties finding your email with the link to your form, search for 'uk.visas.and.immigration.home.office@notifications.service.gov.uk' in your email account.

When you click on 'Go to IHS website' you will be redirected to another website. Here you will be asked to check that your personal details are correct. You will also be asked to provide some information about your course. Use your CAS to help you. Once you have made the IHS payment you will be re-directed back to your application to complete the final steps and pay the visa application fee. This figure may be converted to your local currently rates set by the Home Office. You must then upload any documentary evidence that you're required to provide, and press Confirm to submit your application.

You will receive a confirmation email from UKVI when your application has been submitted where it will then be reviewed by a UKVI caseworker. Processing times are advertised online and are usually 3 weeks. You will receive your visa decision by email with instructions on how you can prove your immigration status as your visa will be digital rather than a physical document.
